



HOW TO CARE FOR YOUR FULLMELT FILTRATION BUBBLE HASH BAGS

Let's start right at the end of the wash, when you are tired and your back and feet are sore... Ahh time to kick back after a hard day washing, roll up some of that good stuff and settle into the rest of the day.

Stop right there, you have forgotten something. A 10 minute exercise that can help preserve your Bubble Hash bags for years to come.

Start by turning the bag inside out and use water from a hose pipe or bucket to get most of the loose grains and plant material off the mesh and side wall fabric before soaking in ethanol. This will save on the amount of time that the mesh needs to be soaked in ethanol.

Add 70% or higher ethanol to a container (a bucket works fine) and submerge the screen in the ethanol for 3-5 minutes – do not worry if you get some ethanol on the side wall fabric or stitching, our bags are tough and can take exposure to ethanol due to their food grade PU coating. Pull the bag out of the ethanol and rub the screen between your hands and fingers to dislodge any resin that is still on the screen.

Rinse with water to get the greasy ethanol layer off the screen and out of the bag.

Repeat steps 2 – 5 as many times as is needed to get the screens clean.

Once the screens are clean, rinse the bags in water and hang them to dry in a shaded outside area with plenty airflow or anywhere really that has good airflow and not a lot of direct sunlight.

Avoid direct sunlight exposure for long periods of time. Avoid using hot water at any point in the cleaning process – cold water from the tap is perfect.

Once dry to the touch and there is no excess water on the mesh or side wall fabric, roll up your bags and store them as you would after every other wash.

SOME WORDS OF ADVICE

The bags perform outstandingly well as bubble hash bags when they are looked after. Cleaning your equipment is an important part of being a Hash maker and looking after your tools. It ensures your screens are clean and function at their optimal from use to use. It also promotes an attitude of cleanliness which as a Hash Maker is next to godliness and is a skill to be mastered on its own.

Mold will grow on wet plant material left in your Bubble Hash bags if you do not properly clean them between uses. This is easy to remove with water and ethanol, but it stinks and can be quite a strange sight.



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FullMelt Filtration Bubble Hash bags are UV resistant but will degrade with excess exposure to sunlight. This does not mean they will degrade in a week or 2 but in a couple of months and you may see bleaching of the canvas and a general weakening of the structure. This will not happen if dried in a shady spot and properly stored between washes.

To properly store your bags, fold the dry FullMelt Filtration Bubble Hash Bag in half and then in half again. Make the sides as straight as you can and roll the bag up from the base to the top rim. Place the rolled-up bag in your carry bag and you are good to go.

It is important that the Bubble Hash bags are completely dry before storage.

The 25 Micron drying screen can be cleaned in the same way as the Bubble Hash Bags themselves.
